Rajkot: Four cops including a sub-inspector and three constables were suspended on Tuesday for negligence and providing an accused in their custody facilities that they are not entitled for.

Sub-Inspector BBRana and constables Upendrasinh Vaghela, Mayvanshi Parmar and Yashpalbhai Zala, were suspended following a probe by

ACP Pramod Behara who found them guilty of facilitating a loot accused while he was being brought to the court for a hearing on Monday.

The probe into the conduct of the cops was ordered after they entered into an altercation with a group of lawyers at the Rajkot sessions court complex.

While parking near the court premises, the cops' car ram-

ped into a parked car of a lawyer. Soothe cops and a group of lawyers entered into a heated altercation. Though no police complaint was filed by either of the parties, lawyer Vishal Gokani whose vehicle suffered a scratch by the cops' car, registered his grievance with the city police commissioner.

Following this CP Manoj Agarwal ordered a probe. He issued an incident and asked Behara to file a report on Tuesday. Behara found that the cops had used a private car instead of a government vehicle to transport the loot accused to the court and had back. This transportation is private vehicle goes against the rules. The cops were found guilty of negligence and facilitating an accused in custody.

Surat: Versatile Minorities Forum (VMF), a city-based non-government organization, has supported the call given by Bharat Bandh on Wednesday by Maulana Sajjad Nomani, Secretary All India Muslim Personal Law board, to protest against Citizen (Amendment) Act (CAA) and National Register of Citizens (NRC).

VMF office-bearers said the strike call has been supported by Babujan Kranti Morcha (BKM) Surat unit and Janit-e-Ulema E-Hind. An AKM has been made to religious minorities-OBTS and SCs in the one-day strike. We have thrashed

The street food stalls in the Muslim-dominated areas will remain shut in support of strike on Wednesday."

Textile Market Workers' Union president Umashanker Mishra said, "We have supported the strike call against CAA and NRC in Surat. All our workers employed in the textile markets have been requested to stay away from work on Wednesday."

Pathan said, "We have supported the bandh call given by Maulana Nomani. All the shops, especially in the Muslim-dominated areas, schools and autorickshaw drivers will join the one-day strike. We have thrashed

After the completion of the trial, additional sessions judge P C Joshi on January 16 acquitted both the girls of rape charges on property.

Man rapes minor niece for 3 yrs, held

Rajkot: A 30-year-old man was arrested for allegedly raping his 17-year-old orphaned niece for nearly three years after she had come to live in his house in Gandhidham in Kutch. The police have also arrested the man's wife (28) for aiding and abetting the crime.

While the man was arrested on Monday, the wife was kept under custody on Tuesday.

According to police, the Class XI girl had come to live with her uncle about three years ago. On January 26, she approached a local NGO saying that she had been raped by her own uncle in the past few years and also ap-

plied the NGO that her aunt was helping her uncle in the crime.

Acting on the girl's complaint the NGO approached the police and got an FIR registered against the uncle on January 26. Based on the complaint police arrested the girl's uncle on Monday and her aunt on Tuesday.

In her statement, the survivor said that she was sexually abused by the uncle for about three years ago when her uncle allegedly spiked her drink one night and raped her. The exploitation then continued frequently and when she could not take it any more she approached the local NGO for help.

Police said that Sonrat had come to Jamnagar for a function in his friends car and was returning to his village in Navagam. On his way back, he gave lift to Vishvarajsinh, his sister Sneha and Chudasma. The couple was also residents of Navagam and had come to Jamnagar city for shopping.

Joshi's brother Nanaji Joshi has become complainant in the case registered at a police post Padana police station. Police sub-inspector DS Wadher is investigating the case.

Speed-demon loses control of car, kills four

Rajkot: Four youths including a teenager were killed and two minor girls injured when the car in which they were travelling cartwheelled 5-4 times after colliding with a motorcycle near Shahar village in Lalpur Taluka of Jamnagar on Tuesday.

The incident happened when Kulddeep Sonrat (21), who was driving at a high speed on a narrow road lost control of the vehicle after hitting a motorcycle coming from the opposite side.



The survivors — Sneha Zala (32) and her cousin Arjuna Jethva (35) — who were in the back seat of the car, confirmed that Sonrat was driving at a very high speed.

He further told the police that after hitting the bike, the car rolled over 4 times and crossed a concrete boundary wall of a factory.

According to police, besides Sonrat, Vishvarajsinh Zala (14) and Sukhdeshvi Jadeda (22), who were inside the car, also died in the accident. Manoj Joshi, who was riding the motorcycle, was rushed to a private hospital, where he succumbed to his injuries. Joshi is resident of Kanakiji village in Lalpur.

Vadotara: A head constable of the Sachin police station in Surat city has been booked at Mahila police station here for domestic violence, assault, molestation, and breach of trust.

Rajeshbhai Tukarnam Thakurkar (P) had registered a complaint on Monday after learning about his husband's name as father in the birth certificate of his son, which was prepared with a colleague and a son born out of the illicit relationship.

Priti, who has been living with her mother at Gotri since October last year, told police that her husband had threatened to kill her. Priti had confronted Thakur about the son born out of his relationship with his colleague Sarvada Chaudhary, after she found a birth certificate from the local hospital. Priti had had Thakur's name as father and Chaudhary's name as mother. Priti's complaint stated that in 2010 she had learnt about Thakur and Chaudhary's extra-marital affair. She

Later the elders of the couple's family met and a settlement was reached wherein Thakur promised that he will improve his behaviour and not indulge in extra-marital affair.

The complaint also stated that a few months after living with Thakur, Priti began having a relationship with Sarvada Chaudhary. "The complaint tolerated the violence as she did not want the future of her 15-year-old son to be affected until she found the birth certificate," said a police official.
